REACH OUT TO YOUR MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT:

The federal government has introduced new requirements for employers applying for the Canada Summer Jobs grant. To be eligible for funding, employers must attest that both the job and the organization's core mandate respect certain "values" as determined by the federal government including the government's position on abortion, sexual orientation and gender identity or expression. Organizations unable or unwilling to make this attestation in whole or in part will be deemed ineligible for the grant. This requirement is clearly unjust.

"He cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another."

Are you an optimist or a pessimist? Do you tend to see a ray of light or a cloud of darkness? It is easy to be overwhelmed by the misery in the world if every day we watch the news with its constant diet of war, violence and tragedy. We can be crushed by the sheer amount of suffering.

In a society which highly values those who are young, healthy and rich, the acknowledgement of sickness and even death is not always welcomed. But the Bible has no qualms about facing these realities. It tells us outright that we are moral and gives us permission to lament our suffering just as Job did. Jesus confronts the misery of the world head-on. He makes the healing of sick people central to his ministry. By entering fully into the misery of the world thorough his cross and resurrection Jesus becomes for us a source of healing. Optimism is a feeling that things will get better, but Christian hope is rooted in a person who has triumphed over death.

In the light of that hope we can pray to God for healing in many ways. God works though the skill of doctors and nurses in our modern hospitals. But the Lord also works in our communities through his presence among us, especially through the sacraments of healing. In baptism we are washed clean, in confirmation we are strengthened in the Spirit and in the sacrament of the sick Christ continues his healing work among us through the laying on of hands. And today, as we come to Mass, we are fed with the bread of life in Holy Communion. But we are also healed by care in our homes through the loving concern of our fellow Christians.
