THE WORD THIS WEEK: "I did not come to call the virtuous, but sinners."



Today's readings are about faith and hope, virtues that are much

needed in a world where people suffer the "demons" of poverty, racial inequality, fear of strangers or fear of anyone who is different from what is accepted as "normal". When our safety and security are threatened, we try to hold on desperately to what we have and what we know.

Jesus gave freedom to those oppressed by demons because he was rooted in the love of God. The Pharisees, being rooted in the letter of the law, were not able to bring freedom to those who were suffering. They sought safety in the law: it was familiar and tried. Jesus stepped outside those boundaries and turned to the indulgent love of God to free the suffering.

We, like the Pharisees, are sometimes trapped by our fears and, not being rooted in the love of God, cannot think and act as Jesus did. In order to ask critical questions about why injustice exists, or to step outside of our comfort zone to try something different to alleviate suffering, we must be rooted in God.

This is one of the central teachings of Jesus, that we are all brothers and sisters, because of our Father in heaven. From this truth that Jesus felt so strongly came much of his preaching – to treat each other as family.

A special characteristic of Jesus was his intimacy with God. He referred to God as his Father. He said the two of them were in fact one. But the reality is that because of that and the vocation of Christ, you and I are capable of being one with God and for eternity. We can now become more intimate with God. We have God portrayed to us as having unbounded love, providence and forgiveness. We can see all these things as we pray the prayer Jesus taught us. The Father's Kingdom is on earth as well as in heaven. He provides daily bread, forgives in the same proportion as we forgive. He is able to deliver us from evil. We have Jesus to thank for that prayer and those insights.

His words are words to us today – he looks around at us and sees us as his brothers and sisters. This will make a difference as to how we see each other.
