THE WORD THIS WEEK: "It is the smallest of the seeds, yet it grows into the biggest shrub of them all."



How does a tree grow? The scientists can give us their answers, but the miracle of life on our earth, in all its dazzling complexity and variety is exactly that - a miracle. God is responsible for the miracle of Nature and growth - how, we don't know, but we accept God's guiding hand as a fact of our faith. This mysterious growth in Nature is used as a parable today, for the life of the Church and the Kingdom of God. Just as a seed, planted and watered, turns by miraculous processes into something different and bigger and beautiful, so the seed of the Gospel will grow into something else, by some means we can never fully understand. And that is the grace of God, encouraging, prompting and helping all men and women of good will to swell the coming Kingdom of our God.

Today's reading reminds us that by doing our best we have succeeded in God's eyes. We are seeds. In striving to please the Lord we continue to grow. In the first reading from the Book of Ezekiel God is talking about his chosen people once more, and how he will protect and nourish them on his Holy Mountain. The Lord has control over the weak and strong of this earth it is in his power to make great kingdoms small and small ones great. God plants the tree on the mountain, giving it life. As with the tree, he has given each of us a life and everything that stems from it. The second Letter to the Corinthians tells us to please him because this demonstrates gratitude for one's life. As the mustard seed of the parable demonstrates, even the smallest seed has the capacity to grow into the largest shrub.

Jesus offers simple words and everyday images: trees, plants and birds. In the Eucharist, we offer bread and wine, gifts of the harvest, each offering once hidden in a very tiny seed. As we gather in a community and

receive the gift of the word, our common faith is strengthened and supported. Privately, one at a time, we receive the Lord into our very being: the harvest of grain and vine nourishing both body and soul. God works through each of us in ways we can't even imagine. By doing our best, we have pleased God; we have not failed.





St. Joseph, guardian of Jesus and chaste husband of Mary, you passed your life in loving fulfillment of duty. You supported the holy family of Nazareth with the work of your hands. Kindly protect those who trustingly come to you. You know their aspirations, their hardships, their hopes. They look to you because they know you will understand and protect them.
