THE WORD THIS WEEK

"Go and sell everything you own and follow me."

In today's story of the rich young man, who comes to Jesus full



of good intentions, there are some simple words that speak so clearly to us. When Jesus tells him to sell everything and give it to the poor, "he was shocked and went away grieving". His face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth. How sad it is that such a keen, and by all accounts, good young man could not free himself from the one thing that was holding him back, his dependence on money. Jesus' words "... how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God!", perhaps indicates his own sadness that the young man could not free himself from this. Jesus' answer implies that keeping the Commandments is not enough. It is a good start, but it is not enough. At first glance it seems as though Jesus is a little harsh with the young man, but then Jesus looks at him and loves him, as if he senses his dilemma.

Is this lesson about divesting oneself of possessions and choosing the frugal itinerant life? Jesus was saying something even more important: give away your attachment not only to possessions, but also to the stature and prestige we associate with possessions. It is easy to get caught up in depending upon ourselves, but our relationship with Jesus calls us to a radical trust. Put Jesus first and let everything else go.

Jesus' answer, said with love, convicts the man of holding back. His words shock the man out of his illusion that he is on his way to eternal life, for "the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword" – he must accept the challenge and go deeper. It is no easy thing – he must sacrifice everything to follow Jesus. It seemed impossible to him. What happened to the man? Did he accept the challenge? Do we? We will never know if the rich man gave away all his possessions to follow Jesus. All we can truly know is what we are willing to give up so we can be true Disciples of Christ.

Canadian Bishops Issue Document on Protection of Minors and Vulnerable Adults

On October 4, the bishops of Canada issued new national guidelines for the protection of minors in Canada. Entitled *Protecting Minors from Sexual Abuse: A Call to the Catholic Faithful in Canada for Healing, Reconciliation, and Transformation*, this document first and foremost, focuses on minors and vulnerable adults, whom Canada's bishops wish to protect from sexual violence.
