The Word This Week "A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends."



Today's Gospel recounts a moment during the Last Supper, the final evening Jesus spent with his disciples. Earlier during the meal, Jesus had told them that he would be betrayed, he would be denied, he would die. What a

somber and sad Passover for his shocked and confused followers.

Jesus has no secrets with his disciples. He opens his heart to them, revealing to them the knowledge the Father has given him and his love for each of them. He demonstrates his profound love and that of his Father by laying down his life for us, suffering and dying on the cross for our salvation. His love has no limits, embracing everyone and giving everything. Jesus invites us to enter into his love and to express this love in our daily lives. This challenging love consists in making sacrifices and reaching out to others freely. It involves loving to the end, with Jesus' same compassion and selflessness. Only if we love one another as he has loved us can we be his true friends. Jesus offers us his love and friendship, a relationship that will transform our lives and give us true joy. Let us accept his offer today by having faith in Him and sharing his merciful love with others.

Mother's Day Prayer

This Mother's Day is different, God. So many cannot visit their beloved mothers or grandmothers, or the women who have been like



mothers. People feel so lonely because their hands are not held, their arms cannot hug. Other families have had too much togetherness and the past months have been tumultuous with tantrums and fights and frayed tempers and too many words said too quickly. Open our ears to hear each other's stories so that we can be a community of hope, nurturing each and every person with tenderness and compassion, each one a treasured member of the family of God.
