# The Word This Week

"If there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her."

Leaving old ways behind is not easy. Today's readings remind us that breaking away from the past is essential to obtaining eternal

life with Jesus. God asks us to look forward to the "new deed he will do", when he will put "water in the wilderness"; we then see the new deed, which Paul talks about, to be the "supreme advantage of knowing Christ Jesus", and sharing the "power of his resurrection"; so who is this Jesus, and how is he "water in the wilderness? It is because he brings hope for the future and forgiveness of our sins, as the Gospel story relates. Sunday's readings are there for encouragement, to help us look forward to Easter, and the meaning of Jesus' Passion, Death and Resurrection: that meaning is Reconciliation and a new creation (as we heard last week). We are driven on through Lent by a vision of the marvels that God has worked, and that God will work for us.

The goodness and mercy of God and our need for repentance, continue to be illustrated all through the Lenten readings. The account of the woman caught in adultery is in reality a story of the conflict of Jesus and the authorities who were intent on putting him to the test. This event took place in the outer court of the Temple, a public place. Here the faithful are instructed in the observance of the Law. The dilemma for Jesus is whether he advocates the appropriate Mosaic sentence - death by stoning - or clings to his own teachings on mercy and compassion. In a society governed by honour and shame, they realize that Jesus has outwitted and humiliated them. Despite her obvious guilt, the woman herself is of minor significance to these authorities (her equally guilty partner has not been dragged forward) and Jesus does not even look at her or address her until they have all left in shame. With compassionate respect, Jesus neither condones nor condemns this stranger, as He invites her to a new life. Acceptance and love allow repentance and change to occur in others far more readily than harsh judgments and unacceptance.

# Lenten Prayers and Devotions

- Begin each morning with the prayer: "Lord, I offer you this day, and all that I think, and do and say."
- YOU ARE FORGIVEN
- Attend daily Mass often as possible.
- Pray the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary.
- Make the Stations of the Cross at home or in parish celebration.
- Read Scripture for 10 minutes every day.
- Pray the Seven Penitential Psalms (Psalms 6, 31, 50, 101, 129 and 142)
- Spend some time in quiet prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.
- Abstain from meat for an extra day or two each week.
- Listen to spiritual music or a spiritual speaker.
- Keep a Lenten journal with your spiritual insights, special intentions, people you want to pray for, hurts and disappointments that you want to offer up and progress reports on your Lenten resolutions.

Try to follow these actions, if you do, the rest will fall into place.
