#### THE WORD THIS WEEK

"Good things came your way, just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony."

Following on from last week ("You cannot be the slave of both God and money") we see a practical illustration of what this means. The division between rich and poor was very striking at the time of Jesus: popular understanding, however, said that to be rich was a blessing from God. All the parables of our Lord are based on everyday happenings. While we hope and pray that the case of the rich man described here is not an everyday occurrence, we cannot doubt but that such cases have happened and will happen again. This rich man is not in eternal torments because he was rich and even very rich. He is in eternal torments because he let his wealth become his master and forgot God and his neighbor and his own real welfare -- eternal life. There are men like him in our world today, men who completely ignore their real future. While they are convinced that their stay on this earth is of very short duration and that they will have to leave it very, very soon, they still act and live as if they had a permanent home here.

This message is brought home in the Gospel, contrasting the rich man's life of comfort, including daily sumptuous feasts, with the impoverished man's life of anguish. The poor man was named Lazarus, which fittingly means "the one whom God helps." God wants to comfort those who are suffering. However, when we are self-centered, we create a great chasm between ourselves and God.

Let us honour God's gift of salvation through acts of compassion, love and mercy. Let us give thanks to God's invitation to enrich ourselves spiritually by living more selflessly and welcoming those less fortunate to our sumptuous feasts. May we respond to the plight of migrants, refugees and others like Lazarus at our gates. May we find true joy and priceless spiritual riches in God's kingdom.
