THE WORD THIS WEEK

"If he listens to you, you have won back your brother."

Unfortunately, there are far too many Christians today who pay no heed to the serious obligation of encouraging an erring brother to give up his sinful ways. They shrug it off by saying: "I have more than enough to do to keep myself from sin" or "am I my brother's keeper"? The answer is in this lesson we have just read. We are our brothers' keepers, and even if we have many temptations and inclinations to sin, we shall not overcome them if we have no time to think of our neighbors' need.

The Gospel today is very specific on how to deal with issues of conflict or disagreement. The scenario Jesus paints could apply to any family, community, workplace or environment which breeds conflict or confusion. It takes courage for us to be persistent and confront contentious issues first in private, then with witnesses and finally in front of the assembly – to provide evidence of injustice or wrongdoing. If after all these measures have been taken and still there is now resolution, we must turn away and move on, knowing that we have done everything humanly possible to rectify the situation.

There is a tremendous difference between Christian correction and rash judgement. Being judgemental seeks and takes pleasure in the faults of others. The Christian admonishment of sinners comes from a place of love. Love motivates us to desire the sanctification of others. This is true love of self and neighbour. It in no way means we give up or are passive; rather, it shows us when to let go and let God. Sometimes this kind of integrity comes at a great cost. Yet is the price too great for the sake of building up the kingdom of God?

May the Holy Spirit rid our hearts of all forms of rash judgement. When necessary, may God also give us the compassion and fortitude to mercifully admonish sinners.
