1st Reading: Leviticus 13.1-2, 45-46 2nd Reading: 1 Corin. 10.31-11.1 Gospel: Mark 1.40-45



Each Sunday the **Responsorial Psalm** is always linked in meaning to the First Reading. Never is this truer than today. To read from Job and then omit or change the Psalm would be disastrous for the meaning of the readings today. Job presents us with the complaints, with the moans and grumbling of the man oppressed by everyday life: speaks of life and death, cites his restlessness and life's struggle and notes that he will not see happiness again. The Psalm responds by pointing to God, whose love is so complete he heals all our ills. It's amazing how, even though the book of Job was written so many centuries ago, there is a very 'contemporary feel to his list of complaints: this should make it easier for the for the congregation to understand.

THE WORD THIS WEEK "He came ... then the fever left her."

The readings today hint both that the kingdom is not yet here and the kingdom is here! On the one hand, Job and Paul give us a bleak version of reality, one filled with weakness, suffering and exhaustion. On the other hand, we have Jesus, in whom heaven and earth come together.

We Christians of today have many advantages over the people of Capernaum of that day. They saw Christ with their bodily eyes as a man of power amongst them; we see him with the eyes of faith as he really was and is - the Son of God who came on earth as man in order to make us sons of God. We know who he really was and we know the full meaning of his mission. We have seen that mission completed amongst us by his death on the cross and his resurrection. By his death he conquered death for us; by his resurrection he opened the gates of heaven for us and led the way there for all who will follow him. Jesus knows what it is like for us: what it is to be human and how demanding people can be. He sees the hurt, pain and suffering we endure. We have the Incarnate Jesus: he brings healing and hope to all humanity. He comes to us, sharing in our humanity and offers healing, friendship and joy - all avenues to transform our suffering into blessings. Jesus proclaims, by his actions of healing, that there

is another world, the Kingdom of God, which will be free from all such anxieties and afflictions. The story of Paradise and the Garden of Eden painted a picture of a world which was perfect, and free from all problems. Jesus came into the world precisely to offer us a return to Eden, if we follow him. Each of his miracles is also, in some sense, a parable or teaching, pointing out to us something of the lost happiness and perfection which he is restoring. This vision of Paradise is not Utopian or delusory, not just a vein hope to comfort us with, but the true manifestation of God's love for us. Jesus could not cure every disease or sickness in the world then: but his miracles of healing are a sign that one day, when the Kingdom comes, sickness and disease will be wiped away for ever.
