THE WORD THIS WEEK

"Whoever is not against us is for us."

There are two very practical lessons we must learn from today's Gospel: the grave obligation we have of not causing scandal to our fellow-Christians or indeed to any man or woman and secondly, the willingness we should have to sacrifice any earthly possession which is a cause of sin to us.

How many times have people been stereotyped and even excluded when we have heard or thought, "but they are not one of us!" Today, we are presented with two instances in which the followers of Moses and Jesus fail to grasp that the Spirit of Lord has no limits and is certainly not under their control.

The apostles did not understand Jesus' inclusive love and outreach. While Moses recognized the Spirit, he understood that not everyone did: "Would that all the Lord's people were Prophets, and that the Lord would put his spirit in them!"

But we are born into a world in which the Spirit of God is already at work. Saint John Paull II affirmed that the Spirit of God is the both God's presence and activity in the world.

Jesus invites us all to live with reverence for a missionary God who moves and acts in ways unknown to us - and to do so with openness and respect for all creation. Our primary responsibility is to prayerfully discern God's presence and how to be faithful today to our baptismal commitment. Jesus gives us a fundamental auideline for both our discernment and discipleship: "Whoever is not against us is for us." May God bless all of our good efforts!
